Trump Administration Is Set to Ban Bump Stock Devices on Guns

WASHINGTON — The Trump administration is preparing to officially ban bump stocks on guns, a move that would put an end to the sale of attachments that allow

semiautomatic rifles to fire faster and that would follow through on an [order President Trump made this year](#) to the Justice Department to regulate the devices.

An administration official said on Wednesday evening that a formal ban will be rolled out in the coming days to weeks, a timeline [first reported](#) by CNN. Mr. Trump, who has in recent weeks hinted that the ban would be coming, first called for the Justice Department to re-examine the regulations after a [mass shooting in February](#) at a Florida high school left 17 dead.

The president's declaration set into motion a chain of events that surprised officials at the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, which had already been tasked with reviewing whether the devices could be banned, a directive given after a [massacre in Las Vegas](#) in October 2017.

In that mass shooting, the [deadliest in modern history](#), a gunman using weapons outfitted with a bump stock device killed 58 people. The gunman [fired off about 90 rounds](#) in 10 seconds.

As recently as last month, Mr. Trump said publicly that a ban would be coming.

“So we're knocking out bump stocks,” [the president said](#) during a news conference announcing a [revamped trade agreement](#) with Canada. “I've told the N.R.A. I've told them: Bump stocks are gone.”

He added: “And over the next couple of weeks, I'll be able to write it up.”

The initiative to ban bump stocks had been met with skepticism by Democratic lawmakers in Congress, who questioned whether the measure would be enough to combat the scourge of mass shootings. (The device was not used in the [shooting in Florida, at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School](#).) The move also drew caution from lawmakers who said taking executive action on the devices could lead to court battles.

The National Rifle Association did not immediately return a request for comment on Wednesday evening, [but the organization initially supported](#) an A.T.F. review of the devices after the Las Vegas shooting. At the same time, the gun association had [also urged Congress](#) to pass a law that would allow concealed-carry permit holders to carry the weapons in all 50 states.

Though he has worked to push through a ban on bump stocks, Mr. Trump remains a vocal supporter of gun rights and the Second Amendment, frequently invoking it as under assault by Democrats.

New Bipartisan Bump Stock Bill Would Actually Ban All Semi-Automatic Rifles

A new congressional proposal to ban bump stocks in the wake of the Las Vegas mass shooting would actually ban all semi-automatic rifles and parts.

A [new gun control proposal in Congress](#) that is being pitched as a bipartisan bump stock ban would actually ban all semi-automatic rifles in the United States, according to an analysis of the proposed bill.

The [legislation](#), which was drafted by Rep. Carlos Curbelo, a Florida Republican, never bans bump stocks by name. Instead, the proposal bans any person from possessing or making any

part that could be used to increase the rate of fire in any semi-automatic rifle. The lead co-sponsor on the gun control bill is Rep. Seth Moulton, a Massachusetts Democrat and U.S. Marines veteran who completed four tours of duty in Iraq.

“It shall be unlawful for any person ... to manufacture, possess, or transfer any part or combination of parts that is designed to increase the rate of fire of a semi-automatic rifle,” the bill [states](#). At no point does the proposed legislation specify a base rate of fire against which any illegal increases would be judged, a potentially fatal flaw in the bill’s drafting. As a result, the proposal arguably institutes a federal ban on any and all parts that would allow the gun to fire at all, since the mere ability to fire a semi-automatic weapon by definition increases its rate of fire from zero.

The design of semi-automatic weapons uses the recoil of the weapon generated by the gas explosion in the chamber when a round is fired to automatically chamber a new round, and prepare the weapon to be fired again. Because of this, any parts used in that process would likely be subject to the federal ban proposed in the Curbelo/Moulton bill, since they serve to increase the rate of fire of a semi-automatic weapon. Gas tubes, gas blocks, buffer springs, magazines, charging handles, ejectors and extractors, and even triggers themselves could potentially be banned under the bipartisan bump stock ban language proposed by Curbelo and Moulton.

The proposal also creates significant implementation challenges, since it contains zero grandfather provisions for existing gun owners or manufacturers. The bill also fails to provide any means by which existing gun owners and manufacturers could turn in their weapons to federal authorities to avoid running afoul of the bill’s effective ban on the possession of any semi-automatic firearms or parts. Absent a statutory federal gun buyback, which is not included in the Curbelo/Moulton bill, it does not appear that current law-abiding gun owners and manufacturers would have any way to abide by the constraints of the law in good faith absent a massive federal confiscation effort.

The National Rifle Association announced on Thursday that it [opposed the Curbelo/Moulton proposal](#). In [a separate statement](#), the organization said the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms And Explosives (ATF) already had the legal authority necessary to ban bump stocks and that additional legislation was unnecessary. The group noted that bump stocks were originally [approved by the Obama administration in 2010](#).

It is unclear at this time whether Curbelo and Moulton intended to propose such an expansive ban on all semi-automatic rifles in the United States. Also unknown is why the authors of the proposal chose to target rates of fire across all weapons instead of specifically banning bump stocks themselves, which consist of a single grip and stock assembly that is designed to rock a rifle back and forth against an individual's finger in order to increase the rate of fire of a semi-automatic rifle weapon.

Neither Curbelo's nor Moulton's office responded to repeated requests for comment and clarification on the design and intent of their gun control proposal.

New York law asks for ‘social media audits’ before gun purchases

If state lawmakers get their way, New Yorkers wanting to buy a handgun might need to hand over their social media passwords and search history for a government ‘audit’ first.

A proposal by Brooklyn-based state Senator Kevin Parker and Borough President Eric Adams, both Democrats, would have the state government reviewing one year of Google, Bing and Yahoo search history of would-be handgun buyers.

The “*social media review*” would also cover three years’ worth of posts on social media sites like Facebook, Twitter and Snapchat, which would be scrutinized for language containing racial/gender bias, slurs, threats and terrorism, according to WKBW-TV in Buffalo.

The proposed measure has run into a hail of criticism from gun rights advocates, with several attorneys pointing out it would run afoul of the US Constitution.

Attorney James Tresmond told WKBW the act would clash with *“The first, the second amendment, the fifth amendment, the fourth amendment, and the 14th amendment.”*

In plain English, this ranges from the issue of freedom of speech and the right to bear arms, to the right to due process, guarantee against unreasonable search and seizure, and equal protection of the laws.

There is even a specific Supreme Court precedent going against the proposed law, attorney Sheldon Boyce pointed out.

*“In the case of *Heller vs District of Columbia* in 2008, the US Supreme Court held that the possession of a hand gun in the home is a fundamental constitutional right so anything that infringes upon that right is subject to challenge,”* Boyce told Buffalo’s WIVB-TV.

Critics of President Donald Trump have repeatedly accused him of lying and exaggerating when he told supporters Democrats were gunning for the Second Amendment. Earlier this month, however, Congressman Eric Swalwell advocated outright gun confiscation modeled after Australia, and told critics that firearm ownership was no defense against tyranny because the “government has nukes.”



California Congressman with 2020 presidential aspirations Eric Swalwell has confirmed he favored confiscating guns and even had a ‘nuclear’ take on what the government would do if it faced resistance. In an op-ed published Thursday in USA Today, Swalwell (D-California) [proposed](#) a \$15 billion buyback program for “*assault weapons*,” as well as criminal prosecution of anyone who chooses to keep their guns.

“So basically Swalwell wants a war. Because that’s what you would get,” airborne veteran and gun pundit Joe Biggs commented on Twitter – to which Swalwell replied that the government would win such a war, because it has atomic weapons.

“And it would be a short war my friend. The government has nukes. Too many of them. But they’re legit,” the congressman wrote.




